**TO: Regulated Health Care Professionals Holding Non-Reimbursable Clinics**
**RE: The Universal Influenza Immunization Program (UIIP) - 2011/2012**

Dear Colleague:

This letter is intended to provide information on Ontario's Universal Influenza Immunization Program (UIIP). It is directed to health care agencies, workplaces, retirement homes and other organizations providing influenza immunization clinics through Ontario's UIIP. UIIP participants receiving this letter must prequalify to participate in the UIIP and access the publicly funded influenza vaccine.

**Vaccine Supply and Delivery**

Vaccine Products	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Agriflu<sup>®</sup> - produced by Novartis (trivalent inactivated vaccine in pre-loaded single dose syringes)</li> <li>• Vaxigrip<sup>®</sup> - produced by Sanofi Pasteur (trivalent inactivated vaccine in multi-dose vial)</li> <li>• Flud<sup>®</sup> - produced by Novartis (trivalent inactivated vaccine with adjuvant targeted to individuals ≥65 years of age and older and available in Ontario for residents of Long-Term Care Homes)</li> </ul>

The ministry has announced that immunization clinics can begin the first week of October 2011. Please consult with your local public health unit to determine vaccine availability for your clinics.

The Flud<sup>®</sup> vaccine is reserved in Ontario for individuals aged 65 years or older who live in Long-Term Care Homes (LTCHs). Regulated health care professionals should not expect to receive this vaccine for their reimbursable clinics. This Flud<sup>®</sup> vaccine will be provided to LTCHs only, through auto-shipments by the local public health units.

## Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (the ministry) UIIP 2011/2012 Recommendations

- All individuals aged 6 months or older who live, work or attend school in Ontario, and who have no contraindications, are encouraged to receive the publicly funded influenza vaccine (Agriflu<sup>®</sup> or Vaxigrip<sup>®</sup>).
- All residents of Ontario LTCHs, who have no contraindications, are encouraged to receive publicly funded Flud<sup>®</sup> vaccine through the UIIP for protection from the influenza virus.

## The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) Recommendations

The NACI *Statement on Seasonal Trivalent Inactivated Influenza Vaccine (TIV) for 2011/2012* is not yet available. When published, the NACI statement will be available on the [Public Health Agency of Canada website](#). The ministry will notify you when the NACI statement becomes available.

## Vaccine Utilization Reporting to the Ministry

As a condition of receiving publicly funded influenza vaccine, all sections of the *Vaccine Utilization Report Non-Reimbursable Clinic* form must be completed where appropriate, including authorization signatures. The following information **must** be reported to the ministry on the report form for all vaccine recipients at the clinic:

- all vaccine doses administered and wasted by lot number; and
- gender and age breakdown by group (risk group or general population).

Completed *Vaccine Utilization Report Non-Reimbursable Clinic* forms must be submitted to the local public health unit as soon as possible but **not more than 10 days** after the date of the influenza immunization clinics. Reports must be received by the ministry no later than **February 28, 2012**.

Enclosed, please find the *Vaccine Utilization Report Non-Reimbursable Clinic* form to facilitate data collection of all doses of influenza vaccine administered through non-reimbursable clinics.
