Listed below are the backgrounds of the founding board chair, board members, and CEO selected for the Central Local Health Integration Network.

Chair – Ken Morrison (Newmarket)

Ken Morrison is president of R.V. Anderson Associates Limited, a consulting firm engaged in the provision of professional engineering, operations and management services for infrastructure and environmental projects. Morrison has a long and productive association with the North York General Hospital. He joined the hospital's foundation board of governors in 1991, serving as chair of the planned giving committee, and then treasurer and finance committee chair. In 1994 Morrison joined the hospital's board of governors and served as vice-chair from 1996-2000, before being elected as chair in 2000.

Vice Chair – Arthur Walker (Bradford)

Arthur Walker has extensive health care governance experience. Until recently, he served as a member of the board of directors at the Southlake Regional Health Centre and the Southlake Retirement Village. Walker also served as director of North York General Hospital from 1973 to 1994 and chair of the hospital from 1982-1988. He has vast experience chairing and leading numerous companies – including serving as chair of Calyx Transportation Group Inc., chair and CEO of Creditz Inc., and director of CEO America Inc.

Member – Sandy Keshen (Richmond Hill)

Sandy Keshen is president and CEO of Reena, a social services agency that supports individuals with developmental disabilities and their families to be fully integrated into the community. Keshen is co-chair of the Ontario Partnership on Aging and Developmental Disabilities. She has served as chair of the Metro Agencies Representative Council and chair of the Ontario Association on Developmental Disabilities. Keshen was also a board member at Whitby Psychiatric Hospital, and a member of the Vaughan Hospital Task Force.

Chief Executive Officer – Hy Eliasoph

Hy Eliasoph was a firm director with the health services practice of Deloitte Inc., responsible for performance management and accountability, financial costing and planning. Prior to that, he was director of strategic health policy at the Ontario Hospital Association (OHA), and executive director of the Joint Policy and Planning Committee, a joint government-OHA body.
