Listed below are the backgrounds of the founding board chair, board members, and CEO selected for the Central West Local Health Integration Network.

Chair – Joe McReynolds (Caledon East)

Joe McReynolds has been the CEO of Ontario Community Support Association since 1998. His community involvement currently includes being a board member of Abbeyfield Caledon Houses and a member of the Caledon Hills Housing Corporation. He was a member of the Halton Peel District Health Council, serving as chair from 2000 to 2003. He was also chair of the Ontario District Health Councils from 2003 to 2004.

Vice Chair – Terry Miller (Brampton)
