Listed below are the backgrounds of the founding board chair, board members and CEO selected for the Hamilton Niagara Haldimand Brant Local Health Integration Network.

Chair – Juanita Gledhill (Hamilton)

Juanita Gledhill, a certified human resources professional, is currently Principal of MCC Group, a human resources consulting firm. Prior to this, she was executive director and manager of human resources and systems for VHA Health and Home Support Services. Until recently, Gledhill was the Vice-chair of Catholic Family Services of Hamilton and is currently a board member of Hamilton's Ronald MacDonald House and the Trillium Foundation Hamilton Grant Review Team. In 2002, she was awarded the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal for Community Service.

Vice-Chair – Jack Brewer (Burlington)

Jack Brewer had a distinguished career with the Royal Bank in British Columbia, Manitoba and Ontario. He was elected municipal utilities commissioner in Oakville in 1984, and has been chair of Oakville Hydro Electric Inc. and the Halton Regional Police Service. He was founding chair of the Oakville Festival of the Classics, and a past honorary chair of Oakville Junior Achievement. He currently sits on the Board of Directors of BCP Bank (Canada and the USA), and is president of the Dundas Valley Golf Club.

Member – Kim Stasiak (Thorold)

Kim Stasiak is a Registered Nurse who works in the emergency unit at Hotel Dieu Hospital in St. Catharines, where she's been employed since 1980. From 1978 to 1980, she worked in the urology unit at the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto. Her community involvement includes serving as the vice president (health) of the Provincial Council of Women and volunteering with the Niagara Healthcare Advocates and the St. Catharines and District Council of Women. She also conducts public speaking and public awareness sessions on health care issues.

Pat Mandy is a respected health care leader with more than 25 years of experience in varied health care management, change management, regulatory, governance and educational roles. Most recently, she served as vice-president of patient services at Hamilton Health Sciences, where she has worked since 1997.
