

## SOUTH WEST LOCAL HEALTH INTEGRATION NETWORK

Listed below are the backgrounds of the chair, founding members and CEO selected for the South West Local Health Integration Network.

### **Chair – Norm Gamble (Meaford)**

Norm Gamble has been the chief administrative officer for the Corporation of the County of Grey since 1990. Prior to this, he held various positions with the Corporation of the City of Cambridge including sports coordinator, director of operations, commissioner of administrative services and acting chief administrative officer. Gamble has held various community posts including being a member of the Board of Directors of the Cambridge Family YMCA, and the Board of Directors of the Cambridge and North Dumfries United Way.

### **Vice-Chair – Janet McEwen (London)**

Janet McEwen has been a board member on the Women's Christian Association of London since 1993 and served as board chair from 2002-2004. McEwen also serves as a board member of St. Leonard's Society of London, having also been board chair from 1997-2002. Since 1999, McEwen has been chair of the Dearness Services (Home for the Aged) Redevelopment Committee. McEwen's community involvement includes being a board member of St. Joseph Health Care in London and a member of the Salvation Army advisory committee.

### **Member – Kerry Blagrove (Listowel)**

Dr. Kerry Blagrove is a partner and co-owner of the Listowel Veterinary Clinic. Dr. Blagrove is a past chair of the Ontario Association of Bovine Practitioners, and founding Chair of the Huron Perth Hospitals Partnership. He was a Board member and Chair of the Listowel Memorial Hospital until appointed to the LHIN.

### **Chief Executive Officer – Tony Woolgar**

Tony Woolgar has extensive knowledge of organizational leadership, strategic development and change management – with 30 years of experience in health services management in Great Britain (including 10 years as CEO of large tertiary and community hospitals).
