

## TORONTO CENTRAL LOCAL HEALTH INTEGRATION NETWORK

Listed below are the backgrounds of the chair, founding board members and CEO selected for the Toronto Central Local Health Integration Network.

### **Chair – Penny Thomsen**

Penny Thomsen has been employed as special advisor to the board of directors of the Canadian Cancer Society's Ontario Division since July 2004 – having been CEO of this organization from 1993 to 2004. She currently sits on the board of directors of the Canadian Tobacco Control Research Initiative and the North American Board and Executive Committee of the Bayer Institute for Health Care Communication. She is also a member of advisory committees for the Occupational Cancer Research Surveillance Project and the Queen's Cancer Research Institute and has served on the board of an academic health science centre.

### **Vice Chair – Daniel Sullivan**

Daniel Sullivan is currently Deputy Chairman of Scotia Capital (The Bank of Nova Scotia). He has been Chairman of the Toronto Stock Exchange and the Investment Dealers' Association of Canada. He was also Chair of the Board of Directors of St Michael's Hospital from 1994-2000. In addition, he is serving, or has served, on a number of organizations including advisory boards of the Rotman School of Management and The Canada Deposit Insurance Corporation, and the Board of Directors of St. Michael's Hospital Foundation, CanStage, The St. Lawrence Centre and Branksome Hall..

### **Member – Harley Nott**

Harley Nott is a lawyer who was for many years employed by the Federal Department of Justice as a litigator and prosecutor. A previous career in forestry on Vancouver Island was cut short by a serious spinal cord injury, which permanently necessitates that he uses a wheelchair for mobility. Nott currently volunteers on projects with the Rick Hansen Institute and has served in the past as a board member and of the the Toronto Rehabilitation Institute and president of the Canadian Parapalegic Association.

### **Chief Executive Officer – Barry Monaghan**

Barry Monaghan has been a health care executive for more than 30 years with extensive experience in government relations, strategic change management, and leading provincial initiatives. He is currently president and CEO of West Park Healthcare Centre, a position he has held from 1986 to 1992 and 1993 to August, 2005. Before that, Monaghan was president and CEO of the Orthopaedic and Arthritic Hospital from 1980 to 1985, director of The Shaver Hospital in St. Catharines from 1976 to 1980, and assistant executive director of Montreal's Queen Elizabeth Hospital. He is currently chair of the Paediatric Cardiac Care Network of Ontario and was past chair of The Ontario Stroke Strategy. He also served as chair of the Cardiac Care Network of Ontario from 1994 to 2001, as a member of the board of directors with the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Ontario, and executive director of the Ontario Ministry of Health's Institutional Division from 1992 to 1993.
