

## Ontario Influenza Bulletin

### 2006-2007 Season

SURVEILLANCE Week 9 (February 25 – March 3) 2007

This issue of the Ontario Influenza Bulletin provides information on the surveillance period from February 25 – March 3, 2007, (Week 9). The analysis for this issue occurred on Thursday March 8, 2007, therefore all data is current to that date unless otherwise specified.

Overall, influenza activity in Ontario during Week 9, 2007, remained about the same when compared to the previous week. One hundred and seven sporadically occurring cases of influenza A were reported through iPHIS from health units, while 5 new institutional outbreaks of influenza A were also reported. In contrast to last week, both Toronto and Central East reported ‘widespread’ influenza activity, while Central West, Eastern, North East, North West and South West regions reported ‘localized’ influenza activity levels.

#### **Long-term care and hospital influenza immunization coverage rates (immunization status as of December 15, 2006):**

##### **Long-Term Care Homes**

For staff: N = 519 (out of 604 sites, 85.9% response rate)

Median immunization rate for staff: **83.1%** (range 16.7-100%)

For residents: N = 519 (85.9% response rate)

Median immunization rate for residents: **95.3%** (range 66.1-100%)

##### **Hospitals**

For staff: N = 170 (out of 226 sites, 75.2 % response rate)

Median vaccination rate: **56.7%** (range 1.8-100%)

**Influenza Subtype(s):**

During Week 9, 4243 isolates were received by the Public Health Agency of Canada, with a total of 803 testing positive for influenza A and 45 for influenza B. The majority of influenza A isolates (282) were from Ontario (35.1%), while 275 (34.3%) were from Quebec, and 100 (12.5%) from Alberta. Forty influenza B isolates were from Quebec (88.9%), while 3 (6.7%) were from Alberta and 1 (2.2%) was from both British Columbia and Saskatchewan.\*

**Antigenic Characterization:**

The National Microbiology Laboratory (NML) has characterized 538 influenza viruses for the 2006-2007 influenza season: 184 A/New Caledonia/20/1999(H1N1)-like, 327 A/Wisconsin/67/05(H3N2)-like, 6 B/Malaysia/2506/2004-like, and 21 B/Shanghai/361/2002-like. All but the B/Shanghai/361/2002-like strain are included in the composition of the 2006-2007 Canadian influenza vaccine. Of the influenza A viruses characterized, 81% of the A(H1N1) viruses were from the West and 64% of the A(H3N2) viruses were from Ontario. Note that the number of A(H3N2) strains identified from British Columbia has been increasing in recent weeks.\*\*

**Antiviral Resistance:**

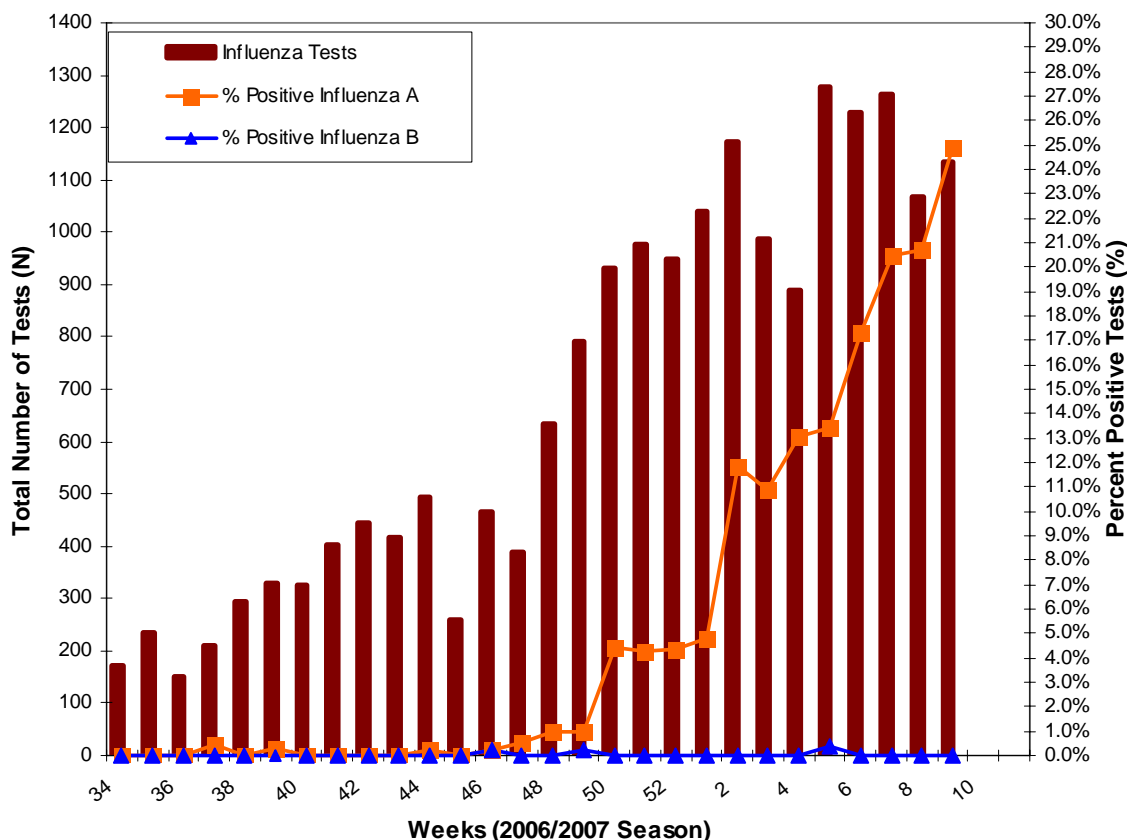
Since the start of the season, the NML has tested 456 influenza A isolates (148 H1N1, 308 H3N2) for amantadine resistance. None of the H1N1 isolates tested were resistant to amantadine; however, 23% (71/308) of the H3N2 isolates were resistant. Of the 438 isolates (415 influenza A, 22 influenza B) tested for oseltamivir resistance, none were found to be resistant.\*\*

**Note:** Based on the World Health Organization recommendations, Canada's National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) recommended the **2006-2007** influenza vaccine contain an **A/New Caledonia-like**, an **A/Wisconsin-like** & a **B/Malaysia-like** virus strain.

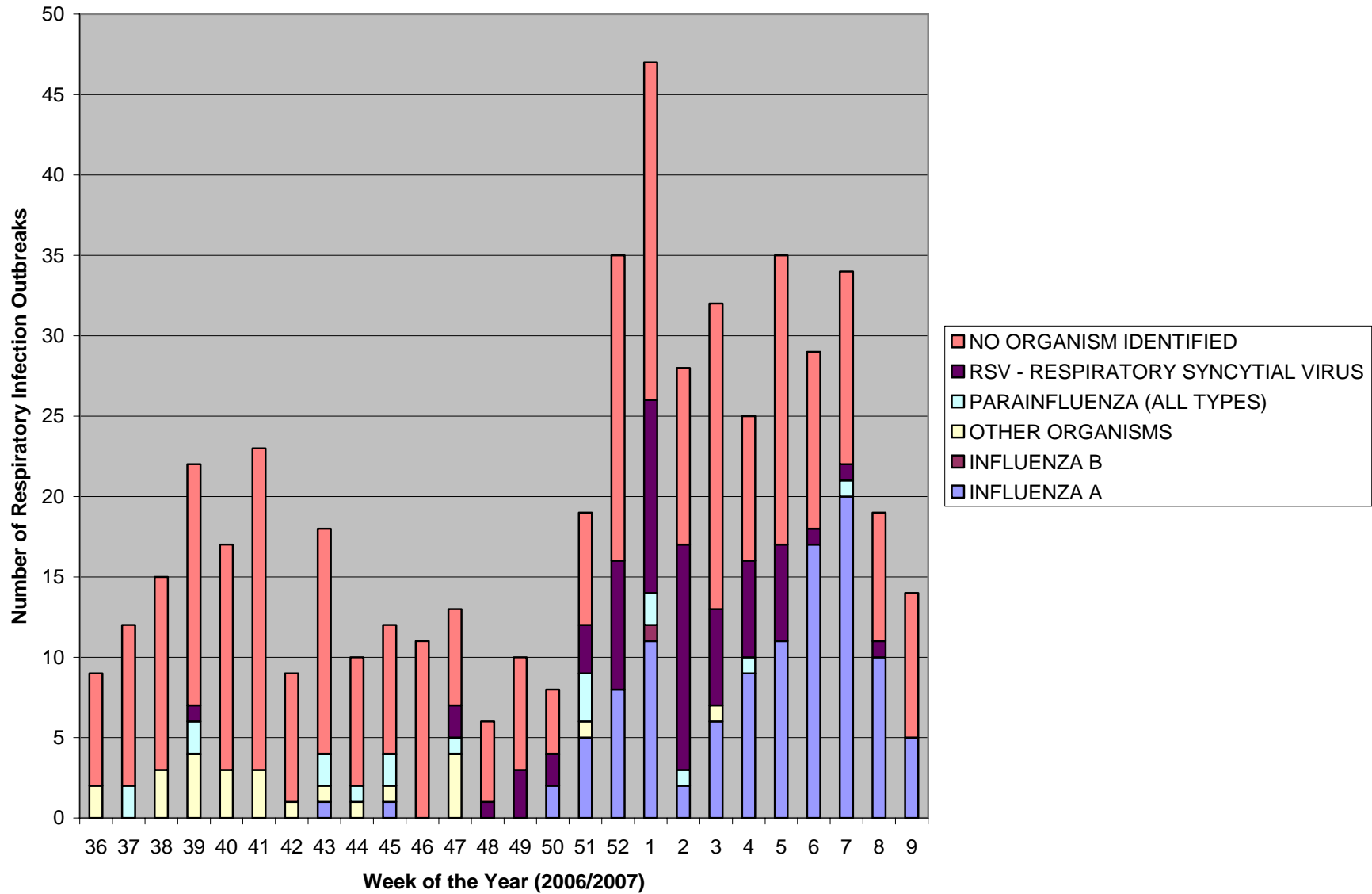
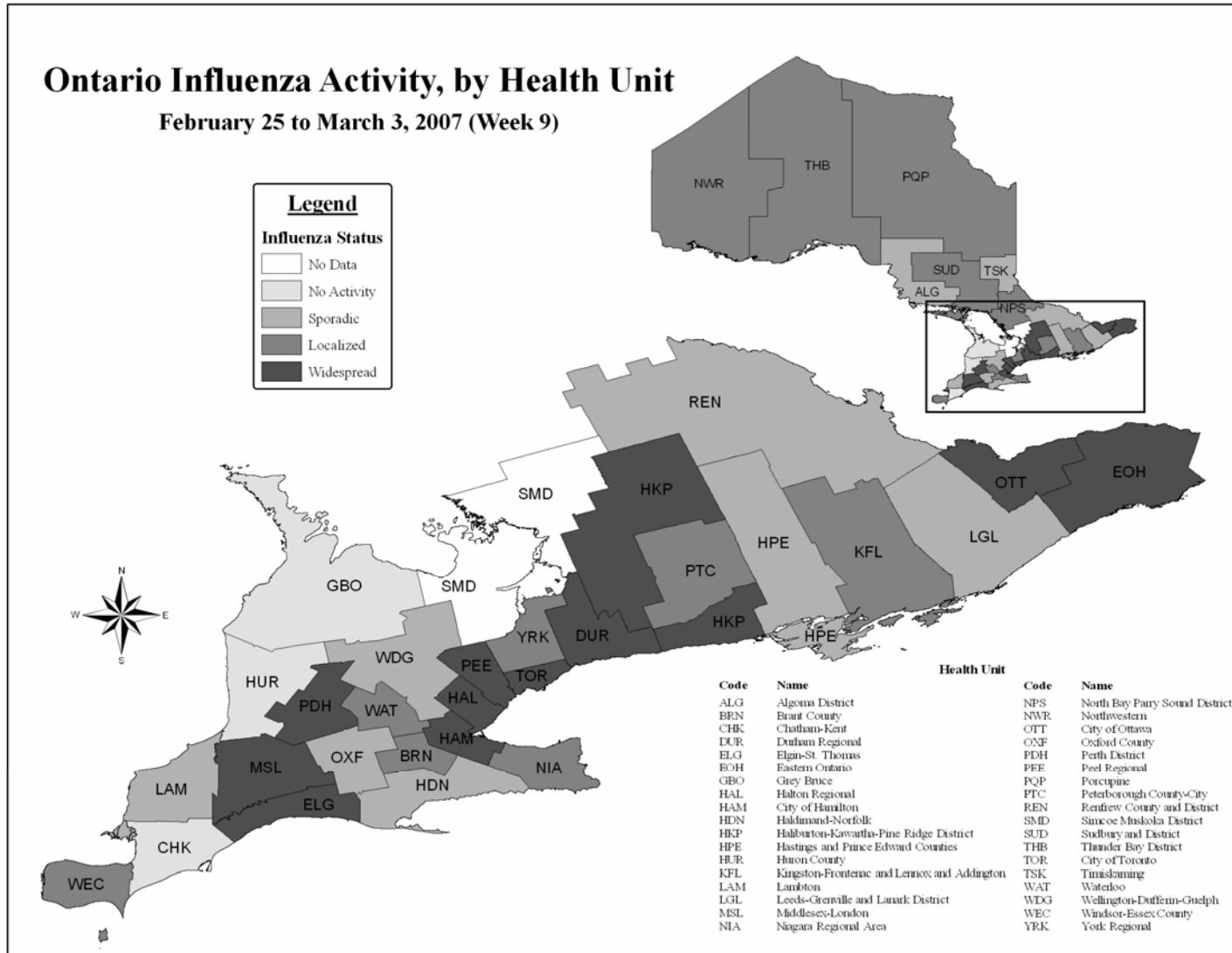


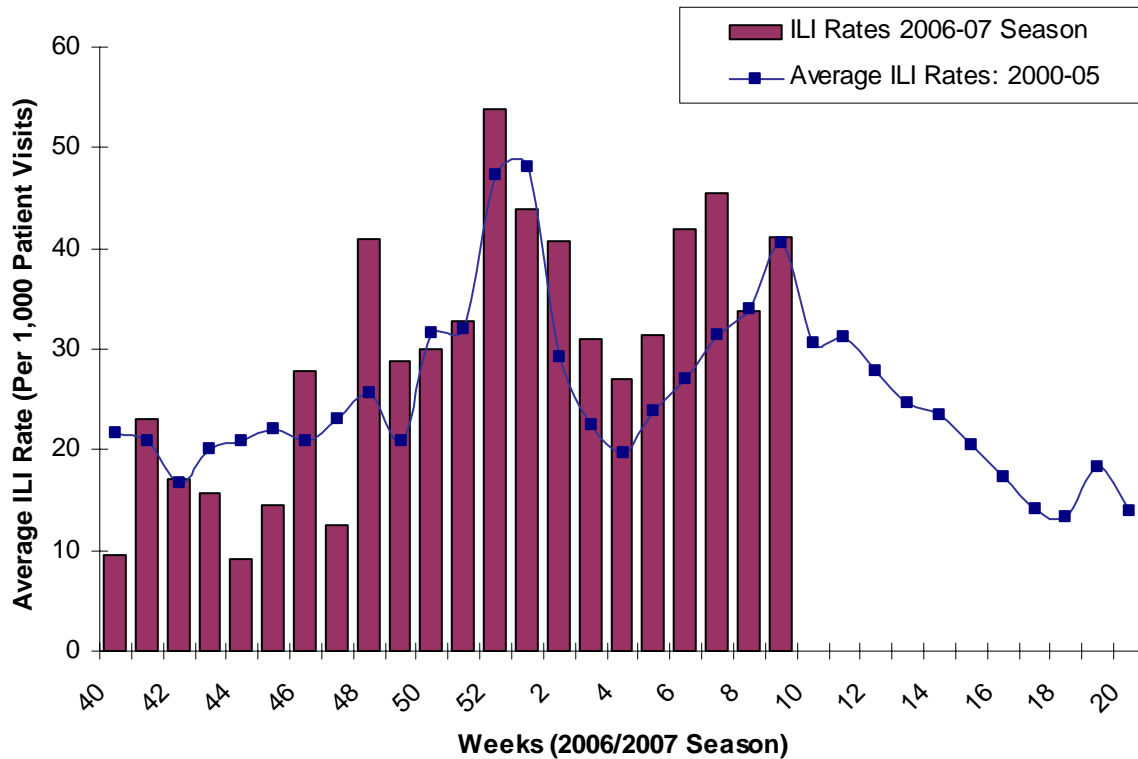
Figure 3: Influenza Activity\* levels in Ontario by health unit & health region for Week 9.

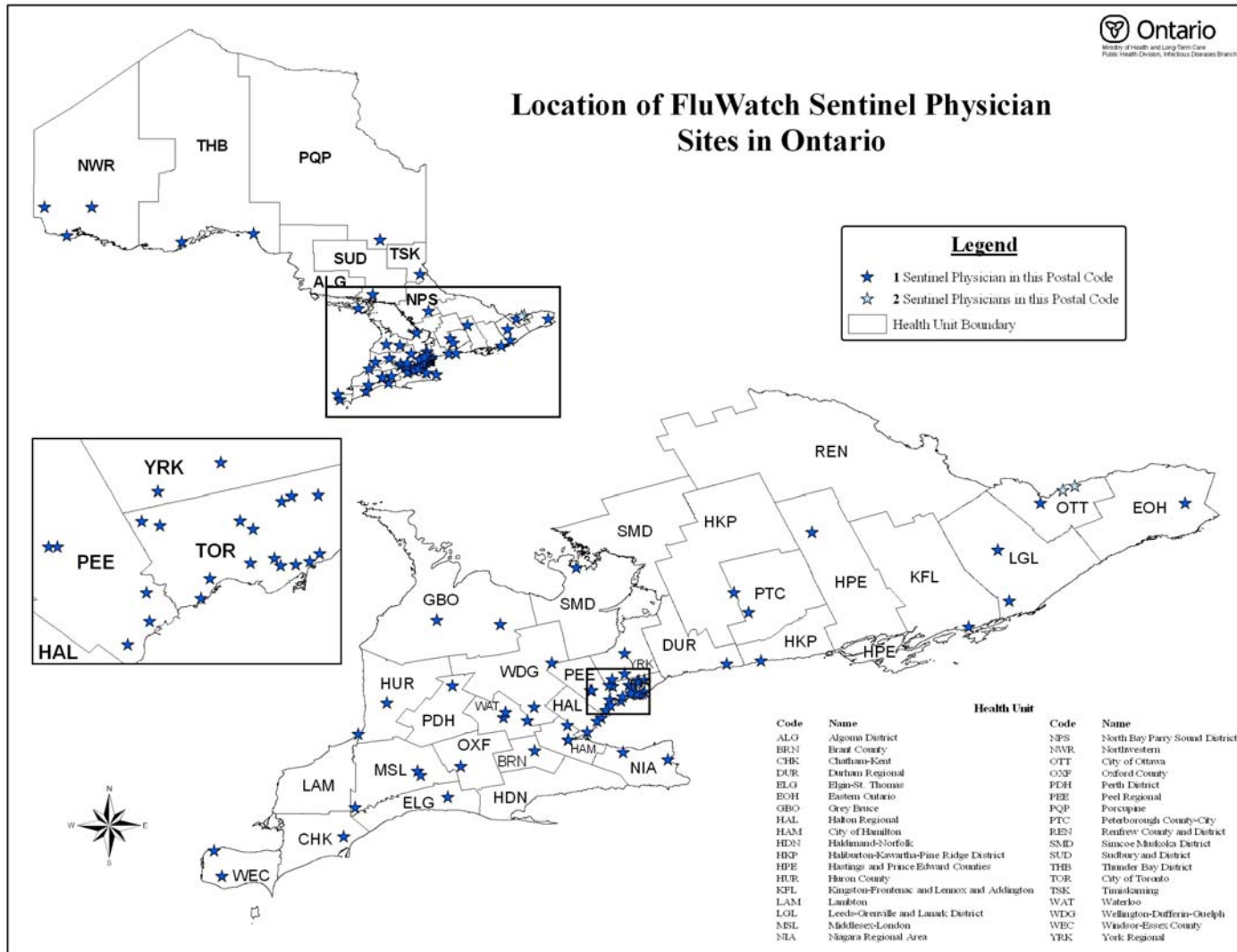

## **APPENDIX - I**

### **Definitions for influenza activity levels:**

**No Data:** No activity report corresponding to the surveillance week was received at the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care Call Centre by the Tuesday (at 4 p.m.) following the end of the surveillance period.

**No Activity:** **No laboratory confirmed\* influenza cases(s) or outbreak detected during the past four weeks** within the influenza surveillance region, however, sporadically occurring ILI may be reported†

**Sporadic:** Sporadically occurring **ILI and laboratory confirmed influenza\* case(s) with NO outbreaks** detected within the influenza surveillance region†

**Localized:** sporadically occurring **ILI and laboratory confirmed influenza\* case(s) together with outbreaks of ILI** in schools and/or worksites or laboratory confirmed influenza in residential institutions occurring **in less than 50% of the influenza surveillance region(s)†**

**Widespread:** sporadically occurring **ILI and laboratory confirmed influenza\* case(s) together with outbreaks of ILI** in schools and/or worksites or laboratory confirmed influenza in residential institutions occurring **in greater than or equal to 50% of the influenza surveillance region(s)†**

\* Confirmation of influenza within the surveillance region at any time within the prior week

† Sub-regions within the province or territory as defined by the provincial/territorial epidemiologist

### **Influenza-Like Illness (ILI) Definitions:**

#### **A) ILI in the general population:**

Acute onset of respiratory illness with fever and cough and with one or more of the following - sore throat, arthralgia, myalgia, or prostration which could be due to influenza virus. In children under 5, gastrointestinal symptoms may also be present. In patients under 5 or 65 and older, fever may not be prominent.

#### **B) ILI/Influenza outbreaks:**

**Schools and work sites:** greater than 10% absenteeism on any day, most likely due to ILI.

**Residential institutions:** two or more cases of ILI within a seven-day period, **including at least one laboratory confirmed case.**
