Ontario Laboratories Information System (OLIS) Questions and Answers for OLIS-Participating Community Labs and Specimen Collection Centres Re: New OLIS Withdrawal of Consent Forms April 2017

1. What has changed with respect to OLIS Withdrawal of Consent forms?

In 2010, the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (the ministry) assumed custody and control of OLIS. The OLIS Withdrawal of Consent form has been updated to reflect this change. Community labs and specimen collection centres (SCCs) will continue to collect and implement OLIS patient consent directives as before but will need to ensure use of the new Withdrawal of Consent form:

Patients who wish to block access to their personal health information in OLIS continue to have three options:

- 1. Complete the new Withdrawal of Consent form at an OLIS-participating community lab or SCC conducting their lab test;
- 2. Contact ServiceOntario at 1-800-291-1405 to withdraw or reinstate consent in OLIS (Note: ServiceOntario processes patient-level directives only); or.
- 3. Continue to address consent management options with their health care practitioner (e.g., physician).

2. What is required of community labs and SCCs?

The ministry asks that community labs and SCCs:

- 1. Make available the Patient Information Sheets about the new Withdrawal of Consent form (in English and French);
- 2. Continue your current practices for collecting completed Withdrawal of Consent forms from patients and forwarding them to eHealth Ontario for processing, if required (Note: Community labs and SCCs with the capacity to process test-level directives will continue to do so as before):

eHealth Ontario will apply consent directives in OLIS within 48 hours (two working days); and

3. If asked, direct patients to contact ServiceOntario if they wish to reinstate consent in OLIS.



3. What is the process if a patient wants to reinstate his/her consent to share personal health information in OLIS?

Patients should be advised that if they wish to reinstate their consent in OLIS, they should call ServiceOntario at 1-800-291-1405. Individuals may also be directed to the Patient Information Sheet, which explains the consent reinstatement process.

4. Where can a community lab or SCC access additional OLIS Withdrawal of Consent forms and Patient Information Sheets?

The ministry is distributing OLIS Withdrawal of Consent forms and Patient Information Sheets to OLIS-participating community labs and SCCs. These documents will also be available on the Government of Ontario Central Forms Repository:
